# Studying at Global University

If you are searching for the next step in your educational, personal, and spiritual journey, you have plenty of opportunities through Global University.

### **Flexibility**

We recognise that, for many people, studying fulltime is not possible and so we've made it feasible for you to study in your own time at your own pace. The flexibility of a Global University educational program means that the time taken to complete the course depends almost entirely on the student.

Each module can be completed over a period of up to 6 months. Extensions are possible if extra time is needed. Students can study between 1 and 5 modules concurrently. If you need to take a break from study, that's fine too.

### Study

When you register for a module, you'll receive an Independent Study Textbook (IST) compiled by an expert, exclusively for Global University. Each IST will guide you through the module with structured lessons and self tests.

Each module is assessed by a combination of written projects, reading assignments, and examinations. (Note that this is for the degree level program of study. Assessment varies for alternative level programs of study).



### **Entry**

Successful applicants to the 3-year undergraduate degree program will posses A-Level or equivalent qualifications. We can offer a 4-year undergraduate degree to those students who do not posses A-Level qualifications.

We may be able to offer further academic discount for ministry experience or transfer credits from another institution. These will be discussed on a case-by-case basis.

### **Options**

We are aware that one size does not fit all, so we are able to offer a number of courses which may better suit your needs.

If you already have an undergraduate degree, we can offer a 'Second Bachelor of Arts' degree which consists of 55 credits (rather than the usual 90). This is available on all 3 undergraduate degree courses.

We can also offer a number of shorter undergraduate certificates for those wishing to study at an undergraduate level without completing a full degree program. These courses range from 15-30 credits. (Full-time equivalent of 6-12 months).

Our alternative levels of study include the Berean School of the Bible and Global University's School for Evangelism and Discipleship. Though these schools do not lead to formal college credits, they do help build personal faith, greater biblical understanding, as well as provide tools to help service in ministry.





# School for Evangelism & Discipleship

The School for Evangelism and Discipleship offers evangelism and discipleship training programs for everyone. The program offerings are concise, biblically sound, Pentecostal, and practical.

### **Purpose**

The purpose of the School for Evangelism and Discipleship (SED) is to impact lives for eternity. With complete dependence on the Holy Spirit, SED will impact lives of every tribe and tongue through evangelism and discipleship training programs. Currently SED materials are available in over 130 languages worldwide where untold millions have been impacted for eternity.

\*Please note that the School for Evangelism & Discipleship does not award college credit equivalents.

### **Study Groups**

If individual study is not your preference, SED courses and programs are well suited for use in study groups where students may study material together. Studying in a group provides immediate contextual application of concepts, as well as group discussions, motivation, accountability, and affirmation. # School for Evangelism & Discipleship

## **Christian Service Program**

Teach your flock the philosophy and practice of Christian Service. The Christian Service Program follows the Bible's guidance for training lay people for God's work. This 18 course program provides a foundation for anyone interested in serving the church.

Every church needs well-trained workers who are able to perform the task of building up the body of Christ and the Christian Service Program has been developed to accomplish this task. Every member of the local church should be involved in the ministry of their church in some way, according to the gifts that they possess. These courses encourage all believers to become involved in ministry.

The series includes 18 courses centred around six themes: Spiritual Life, The Bible, Theology, The Church, Service, Christian Ethics. Students can earn a Christian Service Diploma by fully completing all 18 courses including each final examination.

Continuing education through Global University's Berean School of the Bible doesn't lead to formal college credits, but it does prepare you for leadership roles as well as provide the tools necessary to serve in ministry.

### **Outline and Program Requirements**

Global University's Berean School of the Bible provides Bible and ministry education and training and adult continuing education at academic level. Berean courses do not earn a college credit. However, courses may transfer as credit into a Global University undergraduate degree program under strict guidelines.

After successfully completing a Berean program, the student will be able to:

- Demonstrate basic proficiency in Bible study methodology, especially as this discipline contributes to sermon preparation.
- Demonstrate a practical knowledge of the organisation and basic content of the Old and New Testaments.
- Demonstrate a thorough knowledge of the theological principles and doctrines that serve as a foundation of Pentecostal Christian faith.
- Apply relevant fundamental biblical and theological principles in local ministry contexts.
   These principles include management of interpersonal conflicts, a standard of exemplary ethical conduct, and the servant-oriented use of spiritual authority.
- Demonstrate fundamental proficiency in a variety of pastoral leadership functions, including ecclesial responsibilities, preaching, administration, and chairing meetings.
- Continue the appreciation and practice of lifelong learning.

Students who progress through the program levels will show increased ability in these areas.

### **Monitoring of Progress**

The strategies used to access the achievement of the course goals include end-of-course examinations, service learning requirement ministry reports (SLRs), and graduate follow-up survey results.

### **Study Groups**

Global University provides the opportunity to bring the benefits of group study to students in the local church. Local churches may register as a Berean study group. When the biblical content and practical training in the course materials are combined with the experience and dedication of local leaders, the student receives the benefits of the classroom plus systematic and practical instruction in Berean courses. Students studying in the local church also have the opportunity to apply immediately the concepts they are learning as they minister in their churches and communities.

A study group is a group of students who enrol in a a course together and are guided through that course by a local facilitator. Students who desire to study in a group setting are encouraged to consult with local church leaders about starting a Berean study group in their church.

## Services, Policies, and Programs

#### **Student Status**

Students may have as much time as they need to complete Berean School of the Bible (BSB) programs. However, if there is no activity (enrolment or completion) on a student's record for 18 months, the student is moved to inactive status. If the student chooses to resume studies at a later date, he or she may find that some program requirements have changed and additional coursework may be required.

### **Time Limit for Completing a Course**

Global University BSB courses must be completed with six (6) months from the date the order is processed by Global University. Students are expected to complete their studies within this prescribed length of time. However, extensions can be obtained if more time is required.

#### **Examinations**

Mastery of a course is determined by the successful completion of examinations. Successful completion means the student has earned at least 70 percent of the points available for the course. Chapter review tests (called "Test Yourself") and unit progress evaluations should be completed before proceeding through the remainder of the course. These self-graded evaluations are designed to help the student assess his or her mastery of the course. Answer keys for the chapter rests and unit progress evaluations are usually located in the back of the Independent Study Textbooks (IST).

A final examination is required for every course. Examinations are to be taken closed-book (without the use if books, Bibles, notes, or other materials). If a student fails an examination, he or she is allowed one retake and is charged a retake fee. An alternate exam will be administered for the retake. If a student fails the retake exam, he

or she must re-enrol in the course by paying the current tuition fee and then pass the final examination in order to receive credit for the course.

All Berean School of the Bible ministerial examinations are offered online, which allows students to receive their final exam grade immediately after completion.

### **BSB Grading System**

### **Recommended Reading**

A supplementary reading text is recommended for each Berean School of the Bible course. These texts are not required, but students are strongly encouraged to acquire and read them as part of completing each course.

### **Service Learning Requirements**

Most Berean courses require a service learning requirement (SLR assignment). This is an opportunity for the student to practice in ministry the concepts being learned. The report form must be submitted to Global University. A grade for the course will not be assigned until the student has satisfactorily completed this assignment.



## **Bible and Doctrine Diploma**

Upon completion of the Bible and Doctrine diploma, students should have a basic knowledge of Bible and Theology that will help them in lay ministry roles such as Sunday school instruction, in sharing the gospel with friends and neighbours, and in their personal devotional life.

### **List of Courses**

This diploma is designed to prepare students for Christian living, and it cannot be earned in conjunction with other Berean School of the Bible diploma programs. Ideal for the layperson who desires a deeper knowledge of God's Word, the Bible and Doctrine diploma is awarded upon satisfactory completion of the following courses. ## **Ministerial Studies Diploma**

### **Ministerial Studies Program**

One of the primary purposes of Global University's Berean School of the Bible is to provide training for ministerial candidates who are unable to attend a residential Bible college. Completion of the Ministerial Studies Diploma as described here does not guarantee you will meet specific requirements.





## **Certificates**

The certificate programs through Global University provide specific and basic education in particular areas of need. Courses enhance yours skills in communicating the Christian message. ## **Biblical Interpreter Certificate**

Global University's Undergraduate degrees provide curricula for three main topics relevant to the modern church. The Bible & Theology program allows you to preach and teach the Gospels. Intercultural Studies prepares you for work in foreign countries. Christian Education specialises in teaching in private or religion-based schools.

### **Outline and Program Requirements**

The Undergraduate School of Bible and Theology programs are designed for ministers, ministerial students, and laypersons who desire a biblical education. Degree programs are open to all with a secondary (GCSE) level or equivalent.

### **Degree Programs**

Unless otherwise stated in the specific program description an undergraduate program of study requires that a minimum of 30 credits be earned through the completion of Global University courses. Graduates interested in completing more than one program of study should ask for advice before submitting an application for a new program. Graduates may not enrol in programs of study that are similar to previously completed programs.

To complete additional programs of study graduates must earn credits that were not part of their previous program. The minimum number of additional credits needed is at leat 25 percent of the credits required for the new program of study. The actual number of new courses needed to complete an additional program will vary depending on the courses completed and transfer of credit awarded in previous programs of study.





### **Overarching Goals**

The overarching goals for the degree programs include demonstrated achievement in the following areas. After successfully completing a degree program, the student will:

- Demonstrate a comprehensive knowledge of the theological principles that are foundational to Pentecostal Christian faith.
- Develop and demonstrate written and oral communication skills.
- Apply relevant biblical and theological principles in local ministry contexts.
- Exhibit an awareness and appreciation of the various areas of general education: humanities; fine arts; social, behavioural, and natural sciences; mathematics; oral and written communication; and computer skills.
- Continue the appreciation and practice of lifelong learning.
- Participate effectively in Christian ministry.

The strategies used to assess the achievement of these goals include examinations, service learning requirements (SLRs), collateral reading or writing assignments (CRAs/ CWAs), course-specific projects, and graduate follow-up surveys.

### **Bachelor of Arts**

Global University presently offers three bachelor of arts (BA) degree programs: Bible and Theology, Christian Education, and Intercultural studies.



### **Bible & Theology**

The BA in Bible and Theology is designed to provide the educational background needed by those preparing for pastoral or preaching ministry.



### **Christian Education**

The BA in Christian Education will prepare those expecting to minister in church-related instruction or in the administration of Christian Education.



### Intercultural Studies

The BA in Intercultural studies is designed for those who plan to serve as missionaries. This degree has basic Bible and theology components with emphasis in cross-cultural communication and Christian missions.

### **Three-Year Bachelor of Arts Degree**

The four year BA degree is a 120-credit program requiring a minimum of 30 credits earned through Global University, 15 of which must be in the student's major.

Global University offers three-year bachelor of arts (BA) degree programs for students who have qualified from a qualifying international education system (outside the North American system). The three-year BA degree is a 90-credit program requiring a minimum of 30 credits earned through Global University, 15 of which must be in the student's major.

### **Second Bachelor of Arts Degree**

Individuals who have already earned an accredited bachelor's degree from an outside institution may earn a second BA in Bible and Theology, Christian Education, or Intercultural Studies with Global University. Students must present official transcripts (or academic records) showing they have completed a first degree from an accredited institution.

The Second BA degree is a 55-credit program requiring a minimum of 30 credits earned through Global University, 15 of which must be in the student's major. Students with prior academic study in Bible, Theology, or Church Ministries may be granted transfer of credit.

### **Students Currently Enrolled**

To maintain an active status, degree-level students must enrol in at least one course per calendar year (January-December). If inactive students desire to enrol in a course, they must reapply under the current program of study. Any transfer of credit previously awarded from other schools will be reevaluated to determine if it is applicable to the current program of study. Inactive students who want to re-apply must have at least a 2.00 GPA (Grade Point Average).

#### **Enrolment in Individual Courses**

A student may study individual courses for undergraduate credit without declaring a program of study. Students who declare a program of study must meet the admission requirements of their desired program. Students should keep in mind the courses are presented at university level. Should a student desire to pursue a program of study with Global University, GCSE-level or its equivalent is required. Students may not enrol in more than 18 credits concurrently or during any six-month period without approval from the dean. Students with a GPA below 2.00 may be limited to fewer enrolments during any six month period.

### Selecting an Undergraduate Program of Study

If you are a first-time student and are unsure what program of study to pursue, consider these questions:

- 1. What program of study would best help you achieve your long-term goals?
- 2. What program of study requires courses with topics that interest you?
- 3. Have you completed degree-level course from other schools that might be applied as transferof-credit for specific Global University courses?

You may also select an undeclared program of study. This allows you to enrol in courses at random but does not give you the ability to earn a diploma or degree.

#### **New Student Orientation**

Undergraduate students enrolled in any Global University degree program will be required to complete GUO 1001 *Orientation to Global University Learning*. This course is designed to assess students' prior learning and prepare them for a successful experience with Global University. It must be taken as a student's first or second GU course. A student may be exempted from doing this course under one or more of the following conditions:

- The student is reactivating and has completed at least 18 Global University credits with a GPA of 3.00 or above.
- The student is active and applied under a previous catalog when GUO 1001 was not required.
- The student is studying for personal enrichment or plans to transfer credits to another university (and not complete a Global University program).
- The student has completed GUO 1002 Orientation to Global University Learning.

# Admission into the Second Bachelor's Degree Study Program

To begin a study program leading to a second bachelor's degree, you must do the following:

- 1. Possess a bachelor's degree from a qualified institution.
- Observe all the entrance procedures outlined by your Global University enrolment office, and indicate on your application form that you are applying to work toward a second bachelor's degree.
- Before enrolling in your first Global University course, you must request that the institutions where your previous academic work was completed send an official copy of your transcript to your Global University enrolment office.

#### Student Number

A student is issued a student number when his or her application is processed. The student number must be used on all coursework and on all correspondence or electronic communication between the student and Global University International Office. Under no circumstances will the student be permitted to take an examination or will credit be given for a course without an assigned student number.

The minimum passing score for any individual course is a score of "D-" (60 percent). A minimum GPA of 2.00 is required to earn a degree or diploma.

#### **Academic Performance**

Students academic performance must demonstrate they are benefitting from their undergraduate studies. They should incorporate and practice good study habits that will help ensure they master the learning objectives of each course. It is recommended that all students re-enrol in and pass previously failed courses before enrolling in new courses.

Students with multiple course scores below 73 percent should request counselling from their local enrolment office and explore ways to improve their academic performance. Students who are unable to maintain consistently a 2.00 minimum GPA may be withdrawn from the Undergraduate School of Bible and Theology. Those students are encouraged to pursue other educational options with less academic rigour, such as the Berean School of the Bible programs.

### **Capstone Requirements**

All students must complete a capstone as part of their graduation requirements. These items should be completed when the student is within nine credits of completion or at the time the final exam of their last course is submitted. A degree will not be issued until the capstone requirements have been received and evaluated. Instructions for completing each component can be downloaded from the GU website or mailed upon request.

### **Graduation Requirements**

- 1. All required courses have been successfully completed.
- 2. A minimum of 30 credits have been earned through Global University, 15 of which are in the student's major.
- 3. Cumulative grade point average (GPA) is at least 2.00.
- 4. Capstone requirement has been fulfilled.
- 5. The Global University's Registrar's Office has received the student's request to graduate after the above requirements have been met.

## **Additional Information**

### **University Standards**

Registration at Global University requires adherence to the university's standards of academic integrity. Many of these standards may be intuitively understood and are not listed exhaustively; the following examples represent some basic types of behaviour that are unacceptable:

- Cheating: (a) using unauthorised notes, aids, or information when taking an examination; (b) submitting work down by someone else as your own; (c) copying or paraphrasing someone else's work and submitting it as your own.
- 2. Plagiarising: submitting someone else's work, claiming it as your own, or neglecting to give appropriate documentation when using any kind of reference material. Plagiarism, whether purposeful or unintentional, includes copying or paraphrasing materials from a study guide, textbook, or any other published or unpublished source. Words, thoughts, or ideas taken from any source must be properly documented according to the school's particular Global University Form and Style Guide.
- 3. Fabricating: falsifying or inventing any information, data, or citation.
- 4. Obtaining an unfair advantage: (a) stealing, reproducing, circulating, or otherwise gaining access to examination material prior to the time authorised by the instructor or examination supervisor; (b) unauthorised collaboration on an academic assignment; (c) retaining, possessing, using, or circulating previously given examination materials where those materials clearly indicate they are to be returned to the examination supervisor or to the Global University offices at the conclusion of the examination.

Disciplinary action for not maintaining standards of academic integrity range from lowering a grade for a paper to dismissal from the program, depending on the severity of the offence.

#### **Code of Conduct**

Global University is a Christian educational institution aiming to equip students to fulfil God's calling on their lives. Christian conduct is expected. While Global University reaches many cultures around the world, is is understood that some practices acceptable in one culture may not be acceptable in another.

As Christians we look to Scripture to guide our conduct. Students are expected to conduct themselves according to biblical principles of behaviour. Examples of such principles are found in Romans 12:9-21; Galatians 5:22-23; and Ephesians 4:1-3, 25-32. The Code of Conduct also applies to verbal and written communication with Global University representatives, faculty, staff, and students. Furthermore, it extends to all electronic communication, including threaded discussions and email with faculty and students. Violation of the Code of Conduct may result in disciplinary action, including dismissal from the program.

### **Learning with Technology**

Global University prioritises accessibility for all students, regardless of their available technological resources, and therefore offers courses both in print and via the internet and other electronic media. Students with technology and internet access may submit assignments electronically and take proctored exams online. Many courses are available for PDF download. Students without access to technology may acquire printed materials containing everything needed to complete their courses. Self-paced, independent learners may collaborate with other students using GU's online learning tools and social media.

## **Additional Information**

### **Library Resources**

The Global University Library, located at the International Office in Springfield, Missouri, holds resources that support the curriculum of GU programs and may be utilised for general research. It offers more than 25,000 physical volumes, including books, reference materials, periodicals, maps, microfiche, audio and video materials, and vertical files.

For undergraduate and graduate students, CREDO Reference, Academic Search Elite, and American Theological Library Association (ATLA) databases, which provide access to thousands of e-books, peer reviewed journals, and general reference resources, are available via the Library website at www.library.globaluniversity.edu.

Due to lack of research requirements, Berean School of the Bible students cannot access proprietary databases. However, thousands of freely available resources are available through the Library website.

Students may also direct research questions to a reference librarian using the "Ask-A-Librarian" feature. Global University is continually expanding its online information services to support and enhance the distance learning experience.

### **Application and Enrolment Procedures**

Global University's International Office in Springfield, Missouri, is the head enrolment office. However, Global University UK in Burgess Hill, West Sussex, will help students in the United Kingdom with all application and enrolment processes, as well as communicate with the head office on the students behalf.

Students who enrol through Global University UK will communicate predominately through our Student Services department who oversee all student concerns, progress, course enrolments, and program payments. Students will be contacted by Student Services soon after submitting their initial application.

#### Transfer of Credit

Global University accepts transfer of credit from other institutions of higher learning with recognised accreditation in the following ways:

- 1. A maximum of 90 undergraduate credits into a four-year bachelor of arts degree.
- 2. A maximum of 60 undergraduate credits into a three-year bachelor or arts degree.
- 3. A maximum of 45 undergraduate credits into a ministry diploma.
- 4. A maximum of 25 undergraduate credits into a second bachelor or arts degree.

Each course considered for transfer of credit must be compatible in content with the Global University undergraduate degree or diploma program chosen by the student and must have a minimum grade of "C-" (70 percent) or its equivalent. Courses with a grade of "pass" must be certified by the school as being equivalent to Global University's standard for a "C-" or higher to be accepted.

Students should request official transcripts from all institutions they would like evaluated. A transcript is official when it is sent from the original institution directly to Global University in a sealed envelope. Global also accepts transcripts sent electronically from a valid electronic transcript service such as Parchment, JST, or National Student Clearinghouse. All transcripts and other pertinent documents should be on hand at the time of application. Students who plan to take courses from another school to transfer back to finish a Global University degree must request that an official transcript be sent to Global University BEFORE completing their last Global University course.

Transcripts and official documents must be in English, Spanish, or French or be accompanied by an official translation into English. Where official transcripts are unobtainable due to circumstances beyond the student's control, Global University may accept for review a valid affidavit that substantiates the student's academic record. Global University reserves the right to determine whether it will accept transfer credits from another academic institution.

# **Tuition & Fees**

The fees and tuition costs at Global University UK are kept to an absolute minimum, however, we do recognise that undertaking any level of study is a significant investment in both time and finance and we will do what we can to be accommodating to student needs.

#### More Information

For those not wishing to study on a full-time basis, we have several payment options available. You can pay per module (e.g. for a 3 Credit module, you would pay £160 in total), or you can set up a payment plan to pay via standing order. If you wish to pay via standing order, we ask that you contact us and we'll do our best to work out a plan to suit your needs.

All courses should be fully paid for before a student begins their study. No course can be completed if the student has not paid their fees.

Module materials (i.e. textbooks, online library access etc.) are included in the module fees, however, should a student wish to purchase any books from the required or recommended reading lists, they must do this at their own cost. Required reading materials will be made available to purchase direct from Global University UK, however, you may wish to buy used books at a reduced price online or locally.

### **PayPal**

At Global University UK, our preferred method of handling and processing fees is through PayPal. Students will be sent an invoice outlining the current fees that are due to be paid. Students do not need to have their own PayPal account in order to make payments, rather they can simply follow the steps on the invoice they've received to settle the fee. If students are reluctant to pay through PayPal, they may pay by bank transfer into our account.



## Outline of Payment Process (Berean, Certificates, and Undergraduate studies)

Before beginning a course, students will need to fill out an application form and select the program of study they wish to pursue. The fee for this application will need to be settled before a student can progress with their desired program.

Upon a successful application, students are then required to select the module(s) they wish to study by informing our student services department that will then issue an enrolment form for the student to sign and date.

Students will then be sent a new invoice for the module(s) they are being enrolled in. This invoice must be settled before their course materials can be ordered and delivered.

#### **Other Fees**

Other fees may apply depending on the circumstances. Extra fees may be required in the following instances:

- Transcript Request (a fee is required for each transcript a student orders, both official and unofficial).
- Exam Retake Fee (failed first attempt).
- Change of Program (program of study change, includes cost of a new Degree Audit).
- Course Extension Fee.
- Course Re-enrolment Fee.
- BSB to Undergraduate Application fee (for former BSB student).
- Diploma or Certificate Processing fee.
- Undergraduate Application Reactivation Fee.
- Student Request for Update Degree Audit.
- Course Re-enrolment (option to re-enrol if course is not completed within six months).
- Graduation Application Fee (no cap and gown).
